### September 4th North America Labour Day

Statutory holiday celebrating and honouring the contributions labourers have made to U.S. and Canada.

### September 5-6th Hindu Krishna Jayanthi

This day celebrates the birth of the Hindu God, Krishna for love and compassion and the 8th avatar of Lord Vishnu.

The day is celebrated by fasting, preparing elaborates feast, singing and attending night vigil at the Krishna temple.

## September 14th

Celebrating the finding and recovery of the Cross on which Jesus Christ was crucified. Customs include a holy day of fasting, followed by an after-fast meal.

## September 11th Jain Paryushana Parvarambha

As one of the most holy days for the Jains, 10 days is observed through fasting, extended prayers and deepening of religious understanding by reading their holy scripture. It is a time for spirituality, learning and asking for forgiveness.

# September 14th Orthodox Elevation of the Life Giving Cross September 15 - 17th Jewish Rosh Hashanah

The Jewish New Year. A two day celebration, starting at sundown and ending at sundown on the 27th, that commemorates the creation of Adam and Eve. Customs include sounding the Shofar, praying at the Synagogue and festive meals.

### Ethiopia New Year

September 11th

New Year in Ethiopia. This is a big celebration for Ethiopians around the world. As well as celebrating a new year, Ethiopians also commemorate the return of Queen Sheba from Jerusalem. Customs include Church services, preparation of a special bread and stew, and donning new clothes.

#### September 18th Hindu Ganesh Chaturthi

A ten day festival celebrated in Gujrat and other parts of India to worship the Hindu God Ganesh, who brings happiness, peace and prosperity. Some of the traditions include preparing the home temple with Ganesh present and offering sweet deserts to him.

# September 21st Pagan Autumnal Equinox

Welcoming the fall season, the Pagans call this festival Mabon after the God of Welsh mythology. Mabon is the Child of Light and the son of the Earth Mother Goddess.

### September 24 - 25th Jewish Yom Kippur

This is one the holiest days in the Jewish calendar, known as the Day of Atonement (the day Moses came down from Mount Sinai). Most Jews observing this day will refrain from work. The day is spent in prayer for forgiveness, fasting, blowing of the Shofar to mark the end of Yom Kippur. Greet someone you know by saying "g'mar chatima tovah".

### September

Hispanic Heritage Month - This month recognizes the Mexican revolution in 1810, which lead to Mexico's independence from the Spanish dictatorship.

#### September 26 - 27th Islamic Mawlid Al-Nabi

Many Muslims around the world, celebrate Prophet Mohammed's (Peace Be Upon Him) birthday. It is celebrated by offering prayer, humble feasts and charitable giving.

#### September 27th Ethiopia Meskel

Commemorating the finding of the Cross by St. Helena, Ethiopians celebrate this day as one of the most important feasts of the year. Customs include burning of the Demera, street parties, followed by food and festivities.

#### September 29th Anglican Michaelmas

Known as the Feast of Archangels to commemorate Archangel Michael defeating Satan. Customs include outdoor activities such as horseracing, games and sports with families and friends. Goose is one the many traditional foods, as well as baking special breads.

#### September 29th - October 6th Jewish Sukkot

This holiday commemorates the long journey Jews began to the Promised Land, under the tough desert conditions. Observers will often refrain from working on the first two days and sleep in a sukkah, exposing themselves to the elements that God once sheltered their ancestors from.

#### September 30th Turtle Island/Canada National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

A day to honour the lives of the children who never came home from residential schools, those left behind and survivors who carry tragic histories.
